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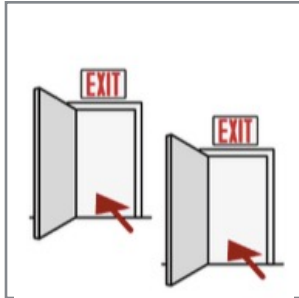
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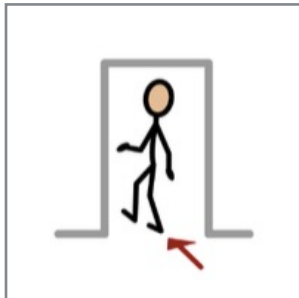
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# FIRE SAFETY PLAN



It is important to set up a fire safety plan in case of a fire! First, find two fire exits in your house.



Practice leaving each room in your house and finding one of these exits.

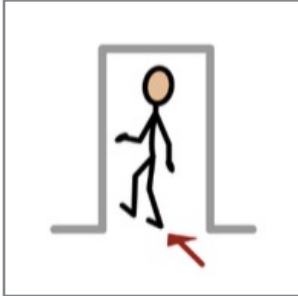


Identify a safe place for your family to meet outside. The safe place should be far from the fire.

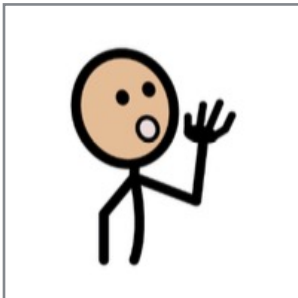


Practice this plan every 6 months. Test your smoke detectors often to make sure they work.

# IN CASE OF A FIRE



If there is a fire in your house, or you see smoke, exit using one of your fire exits.



Tell your family out the fire. Get out safely. **DO NOT** go back into the house until a firefighter tells you it is safe.

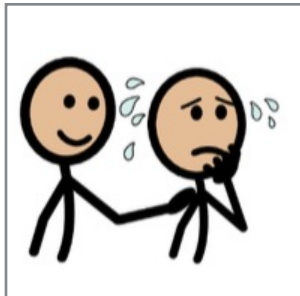


Go to the safe meeting spot outside and wait for your family.



Call 911 and wait for help to arrive.

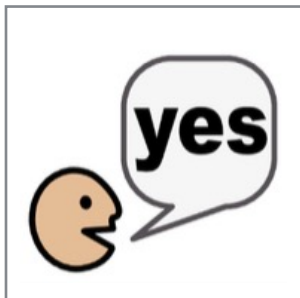
# WHEN FIREFIGHTERS ARRIVE



Firefighters will come to your house if there is a fire. Remember, the firefighters are here to help. Do not be scared. The firefighters have an important job to do.



The firefighters wear protective equipment. They bring hoses, ladders, and special tools. Stay in a safe place out of the firefighters way.

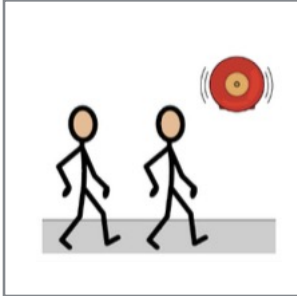


Listen to the firefighters, and answer any questions they ask you. Follow any directions the firefighters give you.

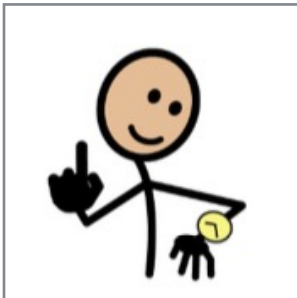


Thank the firefighters for their help when they are all done.

# FIRE DRILLS



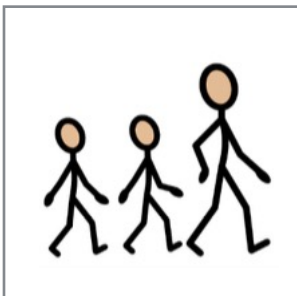
During a fire drill at school, follow your teacher in a single file line outside. Make sure to walk safely, never run!



Wait with your class. Stay quiet and keep your hands to yourself.



Listen to your teacher. Your teacher will tell you when it's time to go back inside.



When the teacher says it is time to go back inside, line up and follow your teacher back to your classroom.
