AAoM was founded in 2009 out of a need to address significant service barriers for individuals and families living with autism spectrum disorder (ASD).

We believe that every family should have access to services to assist with clinical and education goals, to create a safety plan to keep their child from wandering, enjoy resources and entertainment venues in their community, and to access housing, transportation, and employment for independent living. In short, we believe no family member should be limited because they have autism.

Through our three Pillars of Work - Navigation, Education, and Employment - AAoM has served over 40,000 people throughout the state and continues to lead efforts to raise expectations and expand opportunities for autistic persons across their lifespan.

AAoM strives to be a place of hope, here autistic adults and children can feel understood, valued, and accepted and where caregivers can feel heard, supported, and embraced. Through our three Pillars of work, we provide individuals and families living with autism with the tools and resources they need to lead lives that meet their greatest potential.

ABOUT MINAVIGATOR

MiNavigator was created to provide free professional consultation to individuals and families across Michigan affected by autism-based needs. Since inception, we have served over 14,000 persons directly, and thousands more through our community education and training initiatives.

MiNavigator is made up of an interdisciplinary team of professionals, ranging in backgrounds including clinical services, education, vocational rehabilitation, and lived autism experience. Navigators provide resource identification for a variety of needs as they relate to autism. Some of these needs include:

- Gaining a diagnosis of autism
- Identifying a local service provider (e.g., ABA, OT, SLP, etc.)
- Locating recreational and community-based opportunities
- Aiding providers in finding additional support for autistic clients
- And so much more!

The AAoM Provider Forum is a growing online community of autism based service providers from across the state. It's hosted as a private group on AAoM's LinkedIn platform. SAFETY PROGRAM





AAoM's Safety Program strives to protect and serve families in Michigan that are caring for a person with autism. Our Safety Program works to connect families with additional resources related to the varying needs of one's safety. We do this through individualized consultation and guidance, working to understand the unique needs of the person, and identifying options for long-term resolution.

Additionally, the Safety Program includes education of both caregivers and first responders through targeted training events. Our hope is that this education will aid our communities in adapting to the needs that arise in safety situations.

We also offer a GPS Scholarship to families and individuals that are experiencing elopement. Along with our GPS vendor, AAoM is able to provide a wearable GPS device and one year of paid service to eligible applicants. Eligibility for the scholarship is based on the needs experienced by the individual, and presented financial need.

Regular healthcare appointments, including routine vaccinations and annual check-ups, are vital for the overall wellbeing of autistic individuals. By prioritizing health & wellness, those living with autism can feel empowered to lead healthy, fulfilling lives and access the resources and support they need to reach their highest potential.

AAoM prioritizes the general health & wellbeing of its community through various initiatives, such as:

- Maintaining immunization-based resources and integrating further health-focused content into AAoM's Health & Wellness landing page.
- Rotating storytelling between providers, parents/caregivers, and autistic individuals to offer diverse perspectives.
- · Connecting with provider partners across the state in offering consultation towards improved access to their physical facilities and services. This has included staff training and collaboration in facility enhancements such as sensory spaces and kits.

AAOM'S SIGNATURE EVENTS

AAOM hosts annual events throughout the year with the goal of bringing further acceptance, education, and support for the autistic community. These include our regional Navigating Autism Today (NAT) conferences, our Autism Hero Walk, and the Michigan Shines for Autism Gala.

- NAT Conferences: These regionally based conferences seek to disseminate education and share wider resources important to the autistic community. This is an event to bring together families, autistic individuals, and service providers towards a shared goal of identifying further support where needed.
- Autism Hero Walk: The Autism Hero Walk has become the largest gathering of the autistic community in Michigan! Families and autistic persons come together during this day of embrace, to participate in a community walk and activities in the Detroit Zoo, and attend one of the largest autism based vendor fairs.
- Michigan Shines for Autism Gala: This is AAoM's largest fundraising event, which supports our organization overall, including programmatic initiatives. It's an evening of dining, entertainment, and networking to support our autistic community.

AAOM'S SIGNATURE TRAININGS

AAoM provides education opportunities across the state with a number of diverse trainings. Thousands of residents, including caregivers and service providers, have participated in these sessions. Our most popular training has been our Autism 101.

Autism 101 is designed to be broadly relevant and impactful for a wide audience, from professionals to community residents. Additionally, this training teaches the common characteristics and needs that may be associated with autism. It provides background on the development of autism and dispels associated myths. It also aims to make the audience aware of resource options as needed.

Our training options expand into the Watch Me Grow series. This series is designed for professional providers serving autistic clients. The trainings collectively aim to build knowledge around identifying developmental warning signs and appropriate responses to address varying needs. The series includes:

- Watch Me Grow: Developmental Milestones and Red Flags
- **Difficult Conversations**
- Sensory Processing
